A crew arrives generally within one to two days of receipt of the request. Upon arrival, the crew examines the material to be picked up and provides the requesting party a cost figure based on the volume of material picked up and not the amount of time it takes to load the material into a truck. The requesting party then decides whether or not to have the material picked up; items cannot be heavier than what two people can lift. Every effort is made to recycle or donate the material that is picked up.)

ATHLETIC SHOES

Through its Reuse-A-Shoe Program, Nike collects athletic shoes of any kind and any brand and grinds them up. Please note that only athletic shoes without any metal can be accepted. No dress shoes, shoes containing cleats, or shoes that are damp or wet will be accepted. Three types of materials are obtained from this process:

- Nike ground rubber from the outsole is used to make soccer, football, and baseball fields, and weight room flooring;
- Nike ground foam from the midsole is used to make synthetic basketball courts, tennis courts, and playground surfacing tiles; and
- Nike upper fabric from the upper portion of the shoes is used as padding under hardwood basketball floors.

This program enables Nike to donate football and soccer fields, playgrounds, running tracks, and basketball and tennis courts in communities around the world.

BATTERIES (HOUSEHOLD)

Rechargeable Battery Recycling Corporation (RBRC)

The RBRC recycles cell phones and rechargeable batteries found in cordless electronic products such as: power tools, laptop computers, digital cameras, two-way radios, camcorders, cell and cordless phones, and remote

control toys. It recycles the following types of **rechargeable batteries**: nickel cadmium, nickel metal hydride, nickel zinc, lithium ion, and small, sealed lead batteries, weighing up to two pounds. Alkaline, lithium, and non-rechargeable batteries are not accepted for recycling.

Digital or analog **cell phones** with or without the battery or charger, of any make or model, are accepted for recycling. RBRC does **not** accept household cordless phones, mobile installed or bag phones, two-way radios, walkie-talkies, or pagers for recycling.

These recycling programs have been established with retailers, businesses, communities, and public agencies. RBRC reclaims the reusable materials of nickel, iron, cadmium, lead, and cobalt from the batteries. The cell phones are recycled or refurbished and resold, when possible, with a portion of the proceeds going to select charities. The following retailers accept both rechargeable batteries and cell phones for recycling: Black and Decker, Circuit City, The Home Depot, Lowes, Office Depot, RadioShack, Sears, and Target.

Effective July 1, 2006, any retailer (includes sales through outlets, catalogs, and the Internet) in California that sells rechargeable batteries to consumers must establish a system for the acceptance and collection of used rechargeable batteries for reuse, recycling, or proper disposal at no cost to the consumer, and the batteries must be of a type or brand that the retailer sold or previously sold. Unless otherwise noted, the following places accept used household batteries (rechargeable and non-rechargeable) for recycling:

Through its website, www.circuitcity.com/green, Circuit City offers consumers the opportunity to return used household batteries and cell phones of any brand to its stores. In addition, through an arrangement with EZtradein.com (<http://cc.eztradein.com/cc/>), it allows

consumers to receive an estimated value for their old electronics. After creating a trade-in account, the consumer is then provided a pre-paid shipping label to ship the electronics for free. Upon receipt of the electronics, Circuit City then sends the consumer a Circuit City gift card in return. If a consumer's old electronic equipment does not have a trade-in value, then Circuit City provides links to the website of the Consumer Electronics Association (www.mygreenelectronics.com/), where consumers may locate the nearest electronics recycler.

CELL PHONES

Effective July 1, 2006, retailers (includes sales through outlets, catalogs, and the Internet) must have and promote a system for accepting and collecting used cellular phones for reuse, recycling, or proper disposal. At no cost to the consumer, the retailer must accept from a consumer a used cellular phone, whether or not the consumer purchased the phone from the retailer. Also, a retailer that delivers a cellular phone directly to a consumer (e.g. by mail) must provide a mechanism for the reuse, recycling, or disposal of the consumer's old cellular phone. In addition, a retailer must make information available to consumers about cell phone recycling opportunities offered by the retailer and encourage consumers through such means as signage, brochures, advertising materials, and direct communication to use those opportunities.

It recycles the following types of **rechargeable batteries**: nickel cadmium, nickel metal hydride, nickel zinc, lithium ion, and small, sealed lead batteries, weighing up to two pounds. Alkaline, lithium, and non-rechargeable batteries are not accepted for recycling.

Digital or analog **cell phones** with or without the battery or charger, of any make or model, are accepted for recycling. RBRC does **not** accept household cordless phones, mobile installed or bag phones, two-way radios, walkie-talkies, or pagers for recycling.

These recycling programs have been established with retailers, businesses,

communities, and public agencies. RBRC reclaims the reusable materials of nickel, iron, cadmium, lead, and cobalt from the batteries. The cell phones are recycled or refurbished and resold, when possible, with a portion of the proceeds going to select charities. ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT

*Used and unwanted electronic equip-
ment represents one of the fastest
growing waste streams in the world
and particularly, in the United States.
Electronic waste or e-waste for short, is
comprised of various types of comput-
er, office, audio, and video equipment,
including such items as the following:
computers, computer monitors, laptop
computers, copiers, fax machines,
scanners, compact disk and digital
video disk players, and audio and
video cassette recorders. These items
contain a variety of toxic materials
such as lead, cadmium, mercury,*

hexavalent chromium, PVC plastics, and brominated flame retardants. When disposed of in a landfill, over a period of time, these materials can contaminate the soil and ground water.

In an effort to begin addressing this issue, on January 1, 2005, California became the first state in the nation to establish a funding system for the collection and recycling of certain types of electronic equipment. A fee will be charged at the point of sale, including Internet and catalog sales, on electronic devices (e.g. computer monitors, laptop computers, and televisions) that have a video display screen of more than four inches measured diagonally and that contain a cathode ray tube or liquid crystal display.

Effective January 1, 2009, the following new fees will be applied to purchases of such electronic devices with video display screens: The amount of the fee is dependent on the size of the screen:

- \$8.00 when the screen is larger than 4 inches, but smaller than 15 inches;
- \$16.00 when the screen is at least 15 inches, but smaller than 35 inches;
- \$25.00 when the screen is 35 inches or larger.

Under the Electronic Waste Recycling Act of 2003 (aka Senate Bill 20), retailers are required to transmit the fees to the California Board of Equalization, which will deposit the fees into the Electronic Waste Recovery and Recycling Account. The California Integrated Waste Management Board (CIWMB) will administer the program and provide payments to approved recyclers for the covered electronic devices (CEDs) that they have recycled. Approved recyclers may then pay approved collectors for the CEDs that the collector has provided to the recycler.

These funds are to be used to help foster recycling opportunities and to help approved collectors and recyclers offset some of their costs for collecting and properly recycling these CEDs so they are not thrown into California's landfills.

The CEDs under SB 20 as well as other types of electronic equipment should never be thrown into the trash. Use the available resources below for collecting your electronic equipment to be repaired and reused or recycled. Also, contact your local government to determine if one-day electronics collection events are held in your area.

In addition, on January 10, 2006, the California Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) announced that batteries, electronic devices, fluorescent lights, and mercury thermostats may no longer be thrown into the trash as of **February 9, 2006**. As of this date, households and businesses that qualify as a Conditionally Exempt Small Quantity Generator (CESQG) may no longer dispose of such items in the trash. To qualify as a CESQG, a business may not produce more than 100 kilograms (27 gallons or 220 pounds) of hazardous waste per month, including a maximum of 1 kilogram (1 quart or 2.2 pounds) of acutely hazardous waste. Businesses that generate more than this amount are required to use a licensed hazardous waste hauler to manifest and transport their waste. This ban supplements the Department's existing prohibition on the disposal of electronic equipment containing cathode ray tubes, such as computer monitors, televisions, and laptop computers.

e-Bay, the world's largest online marketplace, and **Earth 911** have joined together to establish a Rethink initiative that is designed to educate the public about the different options for safely disposing of electronics, including donation, reuse, recycling, and refurbishing. Visitors to eBay's Rethink site, www.ebay.com/rethink, will be able to easily access Earth 911's database of community resources on local electronics collection programs. Similarly, it will recycle printers, toner, and ink cartridges of any brand for free when a customer purchases these items from Dell. All Dell products may be returned to Dell for free to be recycled. Upon arrival, the crew examines the material to be picked up and provides the requesting party a cost figure based on the volume of material picked up and not the amount of time it takes to load the material into a truck. The requesting party then decides whether or not to have the material picked up; items cannot be heavier than what two people can lift. Every effort is made to recycle or donate the material that is picked up.)

FLUORESCENT LIGHT BULBS/TUBES

Please note that in California, fluorescent lights may **not** be thrown into the trash, since they contain a small amount of mercury. Should a fluorescent light break, please follow the recommended actions below regarding clean-up and disposal:

Before Clean-Up: Air Out the Room

- Have people and pets leave the room, and don't let anyone walk through the breakage area on their way out.
- Open a window and leave the room for 15 minutes or more.
- Shut off the central forced-air heating/air conditioning system, if you have one.

Clean-Up Steps for Hard Surfaces

- Carefully scoop up glass pieces and powder using stiff paper or cardboard and place them in a glass jar with metal lid (such as a canning jar) or in a sealed plastic bag.
- Use sticky tape, such as duct tape, to pick up any remaining small glass fragments and powder.
- Wipe the area clean with damp paper towels or disposable wet wipes. Place towels in the glass jar or plastic bag.

- Do not use a vacuum or broom to clean up the broken bulb on hard surfaces.

Clean-Up Steps for Carpeting or Rug

- Carefully pick up glass fragments and place them in a glass jar with metal lid (such as a canning jar) or in a sealed plastic bag.
- Use sticky tape, such as duct tape, to pick up any remaining small glass fragments and powder.
- If vacuuming is needed after all visible materials are removed, vacuum the area where the bulb was broken.
- Remove the vacuum bag (or empty and wipe the canister), and put the bag or vacuum debris in a sealed plastic bag.

Clean-up Steps for Clothing, Bedding and Other Soft Materials

- If clothing or bedding materials come in direct contact with broken glass or mercury-containing powder from inside the bulb that may stick to the fabric, the clothing or bedding should be thrown away. Do not wash such clothing or bedding because mercury fragments in the clothing may contaminate the machine and/or pollute sewage.
- You can, however, wash clothing or other materials that have been exposed to the mercury vapor from a broken CFL, such as the clothing you are wearing when you cleaned up the broken CFL, as long as that clothing has not come into direct contact with the materials from the broken bulb.
- If shoes come into direct contact with broken glass or mercury-containing powder from the bulb, wipe them off with damp paper towels or disposable wet wipes. Place the towels or wipes in a glass jar or plastic bag for disposal.

Disposal of Clean-up Materials

- Immediately place all clean-up materials outdoors in a trash container or protected area for the next normal trash pickup.
- Wash your hands after disposing of the jars or plastic bags containing clean-up materials.
- In Santa Barbara County, you may take these materials to the hazardous waste facilities in Santa Barbara, Lompoc, or Santa Maria.



Future Cleaning of Carpeting or Rug: Air Out the Room During and After Vacuuming

- The next several times you vacuum, shut off the central forced-air heating/air conditioning system and open a window before vacuuming.
- Keep the central heating/air conditioning system shut off and the window open for at least 15 minutes after vacuuming is completed.

In addition to using compact fluorescent lights, consumers use other products that contain mercury. In the event any of these products break, there are certain steps that should be taken in terms of clean-up and disposal. In addition to providing information on the do's and don'ts if a fluorescent light bulb or thermometer containing mercury breaks, the United States Department of Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) has a website that provides information on storing, transporting, and disposing of mercury: www.epa.gov/mercury/spills/index.htm#/whatnever.

PHARMACEUTICAL WASTE

The proper disposal of pharmaceutical waste, including expired or unwanted prescription and over-the-counter medications, has been a growing challenge nationwide. Traditionally, consumers have thrown unwanted medicines or pharmaceutical waste into their trash containers, have poured them down their sinks, or have flushed them down their toilets. While the latter two options can especially prevent the accidental or purposeful ingestion of inappropriate drugs or dangerously high doses of drugs by those for whom the medication was not intended, particularly children, they should no longer be chosen as disposal options. Pharmaceutical waste disposed of through these options can establish a

long-term harmful presence in the environment from its excreted residues or byproducts that sometimes cannot be removed by sewage treatment or water treatment processes. These residues pose unknown risks to people, animals, and the environment, especially our waterways. Human exposure to such residues can occur by contact, by ingestion of water, or by ingesting food crops grown on land treated with sludge or irrigated with wastewater.

The best option for households to dispose of their pharmaceuticals is to take them to a local hazardous waste collection facility that will accept them. If this option is not available, then the expired or unwanted pharmaceuticals should be thrown into the trash using the following guidelines:

- place old medications in a container with a tight fitting lid;
- if possible, render the medications undesirable and/or unusable by crushing them (if solid) and mixing with small amounts of water, salt, or other substance that would increase the difficulty of consumption;
- as an extra precaution for privacy purposes, remove any personal information from the label (e.g. name, address, and telephone number) by scratching out the information or using a permanent marker to cover the information;
- securely tape the container (e.g. with duct tape) and place it into the trash, preferably on a day of collection so that it is inaccessible to children and pets.

Please note that if the medication is a "controlled substance" (e.g. medications that may be habit forming or have the potential for abuse, such as narcotics or tranquilizers), it cannot be disposed at a hazardous waste facility and therefore, it should be taken to a local law enforcement office (i.e. a city police department or county sheriff's department). Controlled substances are regulated by the Federal Drug Enforcement Administration and can only be legally handled by the patient to whom they are prescribed and by law enforcement. Common examples include

Codeine, Valium, Ritalin, and anabolic steroids.

If you contact your local pharmacy, ask if it properly disposes of unwanted medicines through the use of a hazardous waste contractor. Some pharmacies, unfamiliar with hazardous waste regulations, may dispose of the pharmaceuticals by throwing them into a trash container or by pouring them down the sink.

PLASTICS

Please note that **hard** plastics nos. 3 through 7, in addition to nos. 1 and 2, may now be placed in commingled recycling containers in Santa Barbara County. For a description of the different types of plastic, please see page 11. Also, on pages 50 and 51, see the list of recycling drop-off and buyback centers where hard plastics may be dropped off.

The American Chemistry Council maintains a website to foster the recovery of clean and dry grocery and retail bags and polyethylene, such as stretch wrap and shrink wrap: www.PlasticBagRecycling.org.

The website provides consumers, municipalities and businesses with information on grocery stores and other recovery facility locations that collect plastic bags and film for recycling. The website also includes a film identification section, information on how to set up a collection program, a markets database, and tools to determine the cost-effectiveness of an onsite plastic film recovery program. For information, send an e-mail message to Help@PlasticBagRecycling.org.

The American Chemistry Council has also developed a Recycled Plastic Products Directory. This Directory identifies products made with or packaged in recycled plastic. The American Chemistry Council also maintains a database of buyers and sellers of recycled plastics in the United States and Canada. Both the Directory and the database can be accessed through: www.PlasticResource.com.

In addition, for businesses, the American Chemistry Council has a free referral service to encourage the recovery of scrap plastics along the West Coast. The Recovered Plastics Market Referral Service allows buyers to connect with suppliers. Among the materials that have been recovered through the service include the following: Videotapes, compact disks, empty trash bins, agricultural film, shrink-wrap, polycarbonate water bottles, crates, nylon carpet, clean polystyrene packaging, and other post industrial material.

In Santa Barbara County, grocery stores such as Albertson's, Vons, Ralphs, Scolari's Food & Drug, and Lazy Acres accept plastic bags for recycling. Refer to your local telephone directory for the location nearest you. The following types of plastic bags **are** accepted:

- Grocery bags
- Bread bags, if there is no residue
- Retail bags with the hard plastic and string handles removed
- Newspaper bags
- Dry cleaning bags
- Clear bags labeled with a #2 or a #4.

Please ensure that the plastic bags are clean and dry and do not contain any material.

The following types of plastic are **not** accepted by grocery stores:

- Sandwich, storage, and freezer bags or other plastic used for food packaging (e.g. Saran Wrap)
- Bubble wrap
- Stretch wrap
- Trash bags, including lawn and leaf bags.

The ionization type smoke detectors are not accepted at the hazardous waste collection centers in Santa Barbara County, since such facilities are not permitted to accept radioactive material. Further, such smoke detectors should not be thrown in the trash. Therefore, these types of smoke detectors should be returned to one of the manufacturers/distributors listed in the table on page 60, for safe disposal. When returning a smoke detector to the manufacturer/distributor, include a note that indicates that the detector is intended for disposal and mail it to the address indicated.
