### Closer Than You Think:

### Real Savings:

Goleta Union School District saves an estimated **\$47,000 to \$71,000 per year** by recycling! Their schools recycle between **50% and 67%** of their waste, including green waste and oil.

The superintendent and school board members encouraged principals and faculty to become invested in the recycling program. **It Worked.**

Waste reduction measures, such as removing styrofoam trays and replacing them with reusable trays, were also effectively taken.

They are doing the right thing and protecting their students' environment. At the same time they are keeping their money where it should be - in the classroom and out of the trash can!

## How is it Possible?

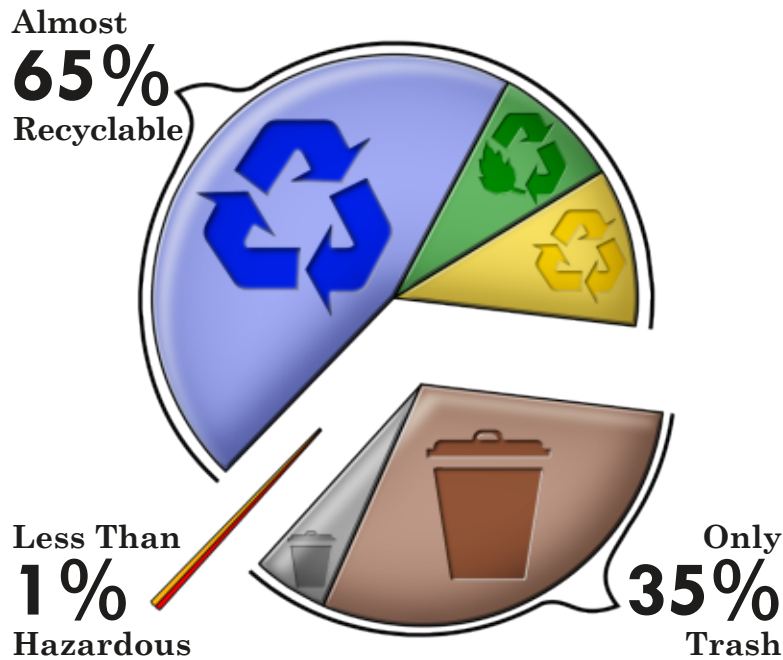
### Understand Your Waste Profile:

Large Appliances	Latex-Based Paint
Plastic Bags & Film	Construction Debris

### Trash:

<b>Compostable Trash:</b>	<b>29.8%</b>

<b>Unrecyclable Trash:</b>	<b>4.8%</b>
All Styrofoam	Paper Milk Cartons

### Hazardous Waste:

<b>Household Hazardous Waste:</b>	<b>0.3%</b>
Lab Chemicals	Oil-Based Paint

Televisions	All Batteries
